

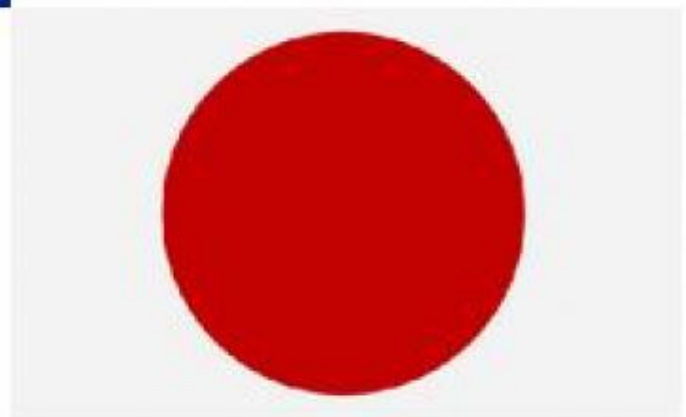


Asian Culture Lovers Delighted with Japanese Culture Week in Cuba

The Japanese Culture Week in Cuba began in Havana with the photo exhibit *Tokyo's Islands* by Kanako Sato.

Sato is an independent Japanese photographer and lecturer in Tokyo's Canon Photography School. Arms Square's Ironwood Street is scheduled to host a high level exhibition by various Japanese martial art schools on Sunday.
