

José Ramón Machado Ventura: Changes in Cuba Will Strengthen Socialism



Sancti Spiritus, July 26 (RHC)-- The Second Secretary of the Communist Party of Cuba and Vice President, José Ramón Machado Ventura, says that the changes taking place in Cuba are designed to strengthen the island's socialist system.
