

Voices from Cuba, Italy and Spain sing a song to Cuba's health brigade



Havana, June 22 (RHC) -- Cuban singers Waldo Mendoza and Pepe López joined in the song 'Por un abrazo' to pay tribute to the Henry Reeve medical brigade, whose members face the Covid-19 pandemic in various nations.

For the production, various local artists joined the Recordings and Musical Editings Company –EGREM– catalogue, including Issac Delgado, Jorge Robaina, Israel Rojas, Haila, Luis Franco, Rosalba Aguilera, Habana Flamenca, as well as various singers from Italy and Spain.
