

US financial and business news website acknowledges Cuba's COVID-19 vaccine program

Havana, February 16 (RHC)--The Business Insider website, one of the leading U.S. financial and economic news sites, [highlighted](#) the progress made by Cuban candidates for vaccination against Covid-19.

The digital site emphasized that the Caribbean nation is working on its vaccination program against the pandemic with homegrown resources.

It highlights that Cuba could be one of the first countries to immunize its entire population this year. It also referred to an interview with British professor Beate Kampmann, director of the Vaccine Center at the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine.

The outstanding researcher highlighted the international prestige of the Cuban Finlay Center and listed it as a solid institution in producing effective vaccines against several diseases for a large part of Latin America.

The article also acknowledged that the country is developing four vaccines in parallel. The Finlay Institute of Vaccines is leading on Soberana 02, and also Soberana 01, which is not as far through the process.
