

Iran receives 250,000 COVID-19 vaccines from China

Tehran, March 2 (RHC)-- Iranian Foreign Ministry spokesman Said Jatibzade confirmed that 250,000 doses of vaccine against the coronavirus pandemic arrived in the country from China. "We appreciate the donation of 250,000 doses of vaccines against COVID-19 by the Government of China, as a new sign of friendship between the two nations," Jatibzade said.

The representative of Iranian diplomacy said that the best way to combat COVID-19 is with global unity, "cooperation to curb the pandemic consolidates the importance of strategic relations," he added.
