Shooting on Mexico-U.S. border kills at least 15 people



Shooting on Mexico-U.S. border kills at least 15 people

Mexico City, June 23 (RHC)-- In Mexico, at least 15 people have been killed in the northern border city of Reynosa after a series of shootings. Four suspected gunmen were also killed, with the majority of victims believed to be bystanders caught in the crossfire. Among the victims were taxi drivers, workers and a nursing student.

Mexican President Andrés Manuel López Obrador has called for an investigation. The city of Reynosa is located across the border from McAllen, Texas, and has been contested territory for drug cartels.

On Tuesday, the top prosecutor in the state of Tamaulipas blamed infighting between members of the Gulf Cartel for the shooting. Tens of thousands of people have been killed or disappeared in Mexico amid a years-long, U.S.-backed war on drugs.
