The Biden administration continues to recognize Guaidó as Venezuela's leader. That's despite his involvement in a failed coup attempt in 2019 and his unsuccessful attempt in 2020 to storm parliament with a group of lawmakers in order to forcefully swear himself in as Venezuela's leader. Guaidó was also linked to a failed coup plot in 2020 led by Venezuelan dissidents and an American mercenary company.
