
## Anti-U.S. rallies continue across Afghanistan over stolen money

The U.S. has frozen nearly \$7 billion in the Afghan central bank's assets since the Taliban takeover in August last year. People say the U.S. should not only unfreeze all of that money but also pay compensation for its war crimes in Afghanistan.
