Cuba highlights potential for relations with the Caribbean and Africa

Havana, September 7 (RHC)-- Rodrigo Malmierca Díaz, Cuba's Minister of Foreign Trade and Investment, highlighted the potential for developing economic relations with Caribbean and African countries during the Afro-Caribbean Trade and Investment Forum.
