The racist move is one of the largest school takeovers ever in the U.S. and comes as an affront to state Democrats and many families in Houston, where 90% of the student body is of color, primarily Black and Latinx.

It's the latest example of largely white and Republican state officials across the U.S. trying to take control over majority-nonwhite cities.
