

Irregular migration increases in Panama through Darien Gap

87,390 travelers arrived at the bordering territory with Colombia from January to March


Panama City, April 9 (RHC)-- The number of people who have crossed Panama's Darien jungle so far on their way to the United States has increased sixfold compared to the same period in 2022, the National Migration Service (SNM) reported.

According to these records, 87,390 travelers arrived at the bordering territory with Colombia from January to March, while 13,791 did so during the same period in 2022.

The National Migration Service stated that 4,905 migrants, mainly Venezuelans, Haitians, and Ecuadorians, arrived through the Darien Gap route from April 1 to 5.

Local authorities, the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF), the International Organization for Migration (IOM), and even the Ombudsman's Office have frequently warned of the rise in irregular migration in the country.
