Serbian president affirms NATO is threat to his country



Serbian president describes NATO as a threat to the country

Havana, April 21 (RHC) - Serbian President Aleksandar Vu?i? today described the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) as a threat to his country, TV Prva channel highlighted.
