Bolivian President Attends World Encounter of Popular Movements at the Vatican



Vatican, October 29 (RHC)-- Bolivian President Evo Morales offered a conference at the Vatican, as part of the program of the World Encounter of Popular Movements, in which he is participating as an indigenous leader.
