U.S. Students on Academic Program in Cuba



Havana, January 7 (RHC) — A group of students from Hartwick College, in the U.S. state of New York, toured several institutions in the south-central Cuban province of Cienfuegos as part of a bilateral academic exchange program.

The 18 U.S. students toured the city and met with professors and students at the medical faculty here to learn about the Cuban health system. They also shared experiences with Cuban lawyers and other professionals.
