

95th Anniversary of China's Communist Party Celebrated in Havana



Havana, July 1 (RHC)-- A solemn ceremony has taken place in Havana to celebrate the 95th anniversary of the Communist Party of China (CPC).

Chinese Ambassador to Havana Zhang Tuo said the CPC has played a key role in the Asian country's development. He said: "The Communist Party of China has realized the dream of founding and developing a great nation, which today is the second global superpower."

Participants in the event on Thursday included Cuban Vice President and Second Secretary of the Cuban Communist Party (PCC) José Ramón Machado Ventura, Politburo member Mercedes López Acea, members of the PCC Central Committee Secretariat, and other senior government and PCC officials.

The Chinese ambassador noted that the Communist Party of China is the world's largest political party with 88 million members.
