Pastors for Peace Continues Fight to End U.S. Blockade of Cuba



Havana, July 25 (RHC)-- The coordinator of the 28th U.S.-Cuba Friendshipment Caravan, Luis Barrios, affirmed that Pastors for Peace will continue the fight to eliminate the economic, commercial and financial blockade imposed by the United States on Cuba more than half a century ago, which he described as "unjust, illegal and immoral."
