
Warming oceans set new temperature records in 2021 as climate crisis worsened



Washington, January 11 (RHC)-- A new study finds ocean temperatures rose to a new record high last year as atmospheric carbon dioxide levels soared to a new high. This comes as Danish researchers reported Greenland's ice sheet lost more mass in 2021 than it gained — for the 25th year in a row.

Meanwhile, the insurance reinvestment firm Munich Re reports 2021 was the second most costly year on record, with insured losses from natural disasters totaling around \$120 billion.
