

The map displays the projected path of Tropical Storm Irene across the North Atlantic. The path begins in the Caribbean near the 1 AM Tuesday mark, moves northward through the Gulf of Mexico, and enters the Atlantic Ocean. It is marked with 'S' symbols at 1 AM Wednesday, 1 AM Thursday, 1 AM Friday, and 1 AM Saturday. A shaded area indicates the storm's potential impact region, extending from the Carolinas up to the New England coast. The map includes state abbreviations and a NOAA logo.

Some increase in strength is expected during the next 24 hours. However, Colin is also expected to lose its tropical cyclone characteristics, and only produce additional rainfall amounts of 1 to 3 inches across eastern North Carolina and central Florida.
